


Parting Message from the Executive Director



It is no surprise to us that so many Canadians, and particularly Torontonians are struggling more than ever to make ends meet, and more adults and children are relying on food banks and other charities to help them with every day basic essentials. Thankfully, with the support of our generous donors and corporate partners, during the period of September to December 2023, we were able to provide students with assistance with the following:

New Executive Director

Continuing our critical mission ensuring no student is left behind and empowered to reach their full potential, we are pleased to announce the appointment of John Wujek, as our new Executive Director.

John brings an extraordinary record of academic leadership and achievement to the Foundation. An inspiring and passionate educator throughout a 33-year career with the Toronto Catholic District School Board, he has left a deeply felt impact in each of his roles as a teacher, principal, and school superintendent. Most recently as a Supervisory Officer, John managed the key portfolio as the Superintendent of Parent Engagement where he forged a legacy of excellence leading Board-wide community-based initiatives, including the critical position as the Directordesignate to the Catholic Parent Involvement Committee (CPIC). With parent voice and accountability at the forefront of his efforts, he guided access to obtain "PRO" (Parent Reaching Out) Grants for local school initiatives funded by the Ontario Ministry of Education. In addition, John collaborated closely with TCDSB Trustees as the Superintendent of Policy and Governance overseeing the priorities of this vital Board committee.

As Principal of the TCDSB's Monsignor Fraser College, John supervised the various campus sites that provide alternative education to some of our highest risk students. His creative utilization of the Ministry's Urban Priorities Grants to help these students overcome diverse challenges is an example of the compassionate experience he will contribute to the Foundation's ongoing mission. This is backed by his extensive involvement working with a variety of community partners from the Ontario Ministry of Education (EDU), Toronto Police Services and the Toronto District School Board. John Wujek officially begins his duties effective Monday, November 20, 2023.

John will lead the Foundation as it continues to deliver on its core business overseeing a \$9 million budget that funds the serving of 1.2 million meals per month in 186 nutrition programs across 166 TCDSB schools, and the many major initiatives under our Guardian Angel Programs that currently averages \$1,000 daily in direct assistance to TCDSB students and families in need.

We Believe in Angels

As if we needed another reason to Believe... The Angel Foundation for Learning was delighted to welcome Olympian Sarah Wells and students from 16 secondary schools to the Catholic Education Centre in November for the official launch of this year's A-Team Believe initiative.

Toronto (TCDSB) secondary school students who are passionate about creating change and helping others in their schools and neighbourhoods are invited to participate in the A-Team Believe Initiative which empowers them to take a leadership role in exploring innovative ideas to help bridge any gaps that exist within their communities. The A-Team Believe Initiative is designed to provide hands-on experience that helps youth develop essential skills that can be applied to all aspects of their lives.

Over a series of leadership sessions, they identify a need or problem that aligns with their passions and develop solutions that can make a real impact in their school or community. The program focuses on building leadership skills, gaining confidence and developing storytelling skills. The culminating pitch day will provide an opportunity to present these innovative solutions and showcase their skills and ideas to a panel of judges. All schools who fully participate in the project will receive a small amount of funding to help bring their ideas to life, and the top three projects will receive additional funds to support the full implementation of their projects/initiatives.

The hope is that these A-Teams will become a permanent fixture in TCDSB schools, with students leading in the effort to encourage their

peers to participate in a wide variety of community service projects throughout the year. We can't wait to see what the 16 A-Teams come up with: Bishop Allen, Father John Redmond, James Cardinal McGuigan, Loretto College.Marshall McLuhan, Monsignor Fraser,Msgr Percy Johnson, Notre Dame, Neil McNeil, St. Joan of Arc, St John Henry Newman, St. John Paul II, St Joseph's College, St. Joseph's Morrow Park, St Mary and St. Mother Teresa.

Let's Make 40 the New 20

Did you know that currently just 20% of all eligible staff have opted in to Cents Off their pay cheques in support of The Angel Foundation for Learning?

Let's double that to 40% so we can help twice as many students every the year.

What is Cents Off? Opt in, and literally just a few pennies will be deducted from each pay cheque throughout the year, which can amount to as little as



2 cents, with an occasional maximum deduction of no more than 99 cents. You won't even notice the difference in your take home pay, but our students will definitely notice as all those pennies will add up to huge support for those who need assistance.

You could win a prize every two weeks just for signing up. AFL is continuing the tradition of bi-weekly draws for a prize pack, and we will also be holding up to three grand prize draws annually.
