## **Supporting Students**

As a charitable foundation, much of the work revolves around generating funds through grants, donations, special events, raffles, auctions and other initiatives, and the past school year was no exception. Some of the highlights from all that activity is highlighted later in this report.

Just as importantly, we remain focused on responding to the growing needs across the Toronto Catholic District School Board. When the pandemic ended, we were all hopeful that life would return to normal. Unfortunately for many families who were hardest hit during that two year period, there has been no economic recovery, and in fact the rapidly escalating cost



of groceries, fuel and other basic necessities has driven even more students into poverty.

Throughout the past year, we provided financial support in a variety of ways to our most vulnerable students:

- •Student Nutrition Programs feeding more than 60,000 students daily
- •SNP Emergency Top Up (to help school nutrition programs with the rising cost of nutritious food): \$351,000.00
- •Grocery Cards (to help feed hungry students during the summer): \$277,250.00
- •School Allocations (to ensure that financial

circumstances do not prevent students from participating in excursions, overnight learning experiences and leadership opportunities): \$13,383.99

- Vouchers for school apparel: \$25,000.00
- Vouchers to offset the cost of application fees to college and university: \$25,300.00
- Reliable Life Fund (for eye glasses, hearing aids, Epi-pens and more): \$13,263.43
- Extreme Needs Fund (to provide support in catastrophic circumstances): \$17,268.58
- Social Work Emergency Fund: \$97,954.47
- Student Bursaries: \$49,268.00
- Support for Newcomers through the Loretto Fund: \$32,222.64

## **Angels Are Everywhere**

We can all do the work of angels, and looking back on the year that was, it is clear that there are countless individuals who are making a huge difference in the lives of others. Check out some of these highlights from 2022-2023:

#### **A-Team Believe Initiative**

With the partnership of TCDSB's Focus on Youth and former Olympian and motivational speaker Sarah Wells, AFL embarked on a new venture, The A-Team Believe initiative. All secondary schools were asked to consider starting up on A-Team in their schools to lead the charge with philanthropy and social justice, and these teams and staff mentors were invited to a series of workshops to discern local goals and develop plans as to how best to respond to the needs in their local school communities. Seven schools participated in the pilot, and after completing the virtual sessions, they

were invited to an in person pitch day to present their passion projects. All participating schools received \$500 simply for participating in the pilot project. A panel of volunteer judges reviewed the presentations and tried to determine the top three presentations. The winning schools, Notre Dame, St. Mother Teresa and St. Basil the Great won an additional \$2,000, \$1,000 and \$500 to help them put their plans into action.



ATeam at Notre Dame began working on their new student lounge in the spring of 2023.

The first school to launch an A-Team was St. John Paul II, with one of their first initiatives being the packaging and distribution of meals to the homeless in downtown Toronto.







By the end of the year, up to 10 local A-Teams were active or planning ahead for the 2023-2024 school year, and at least one elementary school has expressed interest in starting an A-Team. ## Marlies Recognized for Ongoing Commitment to Students

AFL was proud to nominate The Toronto Marlies (MLSE) for the Friends of Catholic Education Award 2023 to Marlies Award in recognition for their long-standing partnership.

For more than a decade, the Marlies have partnered with AFL on the annual "fun-raiser" the AFL-TCDSB-Marlies Health Action Day (also known as the Marlies School Day



Game) which brings together elementary students for a home game at Coca Cola Coliseum. The 2023 game was pretty much a sell out, and the Marlies donated more than \$21,000 from that game to The Angel Foundations.

New during the 2022-2023 season, the Marlies also offered discounted tickets to the AFL/TCDSB community with \$3 from each ticket sold being donated to AFL. They also offered free tickets to newcomer students and families from Ukraine, and to the 2023 TCDSB Student Achievement Award winners, and worked closely with staff in some of the Specialist High Skills Major programs on career forums. This is all in addition to their support of a variety of AFL events throughout the year such as auctions and the Charity Golf Day.



## Keeping the "Fun" in Fundraising

AFL continued the tradition of engaging the community in a wide variety of fundraising activities. We continued to run 50-50 Raffles, fully licensed by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario three times during the 2022-23 school year. The last draw of the school year brought in a record setting jackpot of \$60,000 with one lucky individual taking home a cash prize of just over \$30,000. Johnson Insurance sponsored some of these online raffles to help defray the administrative costs associated with the raffle platform.

Two online auctions were held during the year, with a wide variety of merchandise and experiences up for grabs. In addition, thanks to the generosity of individual donors, several flash auctions were also held for private suites to hockey games, and soccer and hockey tickets at various times during the year. We thank Edge Imaging for sponsoring the spring auction.



The annual Charity Golf Day, hosted by Lebovic Golf Club, was once again a huge hit, with sponsors and participants helping to raise just over \$40,000. We also continued the annual traditions of our May the 4th Be With You boardwide civvies day, our Christmas Market

and Christmas card sales featuring cards designed by talented TCDSB students, in addition to a few promotional contests held just for the fun of it to celebrate special occasions like Mother's Day and Father's Day.

### **New connections with Argos and Raptors905**

During the 2022-2023 school year, the Angel Foundation embarked on new initiatives with MLSE's Toronto Argos and Raptors905.

Both organizations provided discount codes to the AFL and TCDSB communities, which also had a charitable component.
